

## **In the NIC of Time: Six Months of Progress for the National Interoperability Collaborative**

The [National Interoperability Collaborative](#) (NIC) is designed to increase collaboration among the sectors that impact health and well-being by improving information-sharing, interoperability and the use of modern technology. NIC has made considerable progress since it was launched in June 2017 at the 12<sup>th</sup> Annual National Symposium of the Stewards of Change Institute.

SOCI and AcademyHealth are the organizational leaders of NIC, which is being built with \$1.2 million in seed funding from [The Kresge Foundation](#), with additional support from **IBM, Microsoft and the Annie E. Casey Foundation**. NIC's initial partners are the Health and Human Services agencies of California, Connecticut and Virginia; the Silicon Valley Regional Data Trust in California; and the Healthcare Information Management and Systems Society (HIMSS).

NIC is engaged in an interoperability-related initiative with each of its partners, primarily focused on the heroin/opioid crisis, early childhood education and development, education more broadly, or shaping information-sharing agreements across domains, programs and jurisdictions. In addition, we've begun creating case studies as part of NIC's work with our partners. In addition, AcademyHealth is conducting **an environmental scan of existing guidance about interoperability** (which we'll release this March), including a literature review and interviews with subject matter experts. Down the line, we are also planning to publish a comprehensive white paper with best practices, recommendations and next steps.

The environmental scan will be released at the first major NIC event, titled "**A Symposium in the NIC of Time: Advancing Information-Sharing in California and Beyond.**" It will be held March 26-27 in Sacramento, underwritten by the **Chan Zuckerberg Initiative** and organized by SOCI in collaboration with AcademyHealth, the **California Health and Human Services Agency** and the **Silicon Valley Regional Data Trust**. Attendees will be connected to key programmatic and thought leaders from around the U.S.; will hear about pioneering interoperability efforts; and will learn about leading-edge activities across five domains that impact health and well-being.

Among the highlights of the event will be a couple of important "unveilings." The first is the official launch of an initiative we're particularly excited about, the **InterOptimability Training Curriculum and Certification** program; we'll showcase ITCC's first two modules, on achieving InterOptimability (think Interoperability + Optimization) and on privacy and confidentiality (developing secure, effective cross-jurisdiction information-sharing agreements). We'll also show display our two new websites – **NIC's portal**, through which we'll facilitate collaborations; highlight innovative projects; and share a broad range of information; and an **updated SOCI site**.

There's much more that we've been doing, from NIC-related presentations at conferences, the most recent at the IJIS Institute's Opioid Technology Summit, to a webinar with the Strategic Health Information Exchange Collaborative (SHIEC).
